

ENROLMENTS FOR 2022: Keep them coming in !!!!

Parents are invited to enrol their children at St Mary Mackillop Catholic School when they turn three, and I strongly advise to not leave this to the last minute even if you have children already attending our school.

Preference is given to children who are baptised Catholic.

To enrol at St Mary Mackillop Catholic School you are required to provide the following:

- A completed pre-enrolment form signed by both parents (which is available at our School Office or on our school website)
- A Preference Certificate signed by a Catholic Priest and stamped with a parish stamp.
- Original birth certificate or passport
- Original baptism certificate
- A passport must be sighted showing the residency status of a child who is born outside of New Zealand
- Immunisation certificate.

School Lunches:

- Reduced cost for families in sending your child to school

School Health Clinic:

Our school health clinic is open between 9.30am – 2.30pm, Monday - Friday. This is located in the breakout space in our C Pod area (Year 5 & 6).

If your child becomes unwell whilst at school, they should see either our school nurse or our whanau support worker who will assess them and decide whether they can be treated and return to class, or need to be collected and recover at home. Your child's safety is important to us and we need to be aware of their whereabouts. If not in class, they should not be arranging with caregivers directly to go home. We appreciate your assistance in ensuring this process runs smoothly

and supports our students appropriately. What health services does our school health team

Your child can be seen for a range of child health conditions such as:

- Sore throat checks
- Health weight management
- Skin checks

- Breathing health (respiratory)
- Head lice asthma
- Dental health
- **Immunisations**
