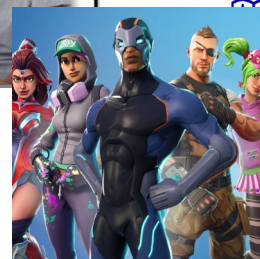
This year we're supporting the students and staff of **Apifo'ou College** to rebuild classrooms and replace resources damaged by Cyclone Gita.
