The Unique Position of the Maori Culture

School will endeavour to develop an awareness of Tikanga Maori and Te Reo Maori and provide the means of fostering better cultural understanding consistent with the Treaty of Waitangi. Delivering the Religious Education programme which provides a direct link to Maori Spirituality. Treaty of Waitangi included in professional standards. Basic Te Reo is taught in all classrooms and evident in room environments.

Cultural Diversity and Maori Dimension

Classrooms and school celebrations will reflect Maori culture through signage, waiata and greetings. Our connected curriculum will include components of Tikanga Maori as appropriate to the topic and the class level. Maori and Pasifika greetings are promoted. Celebrating through worship and prayer the cultural diversity within the school.

All such requests will be given full and careful consideration by the BOT with regard to personnel with the requisite skills and qualifications; the overall school financial position and the availability of accommodation within the school.

The school will consult Maori through the school families, through maintaining an open door practice, and through formal written contact. Individual interviews with the caregivers of Maori students: highlighting how can we improve the education of their child.
